I am working across a range of work packages covering comparative policy analysis, health determinants/consequences of extending working lives (longitudinal analysis), and qualitative case studies in the social care sector.

This project is investigating the extent to which health inequalities research and policy across England pays attention to health disparities with respect to ethnic minority and migrant status.

Chronic disease intersectionalities and biomarker research

I am currently writing papers and preparing research bids focussing on the use of intersectionality theory to inform research on chronic disease inequalities in older people, with a focus on exploiting the increasing availability of biomarker data available in national surveys.

Public health/medicine

I am also contributing to a stream of work in the field of public health and medicine centred around peer support interventions, diabetes, risk factors models for hospitalisation, and cost-benefit analyses, which mainly uses NHS and randomised controlled trial data.
